A Message From The President

Stephen Metelits

We are sponsoring a class June 20-21 that contains information important for you, your family, and your clients. My reasons for stressing the importance of this class are included in the following paragraphs.

The baby boomer generation is entering, or is about to enter, retirement. Our population is aging. One of the fastest growing segments of our society is the over 85's. Prices of most everything, including food and fuel plus health care, are rising rapidly. A worry for many older Americans is out-living their savings.

Medicare will be spending more than it takes in within a decade. Social Security will reach that point before we reach the quarter point of this century. What can we do to protect ourselves?

Then there is the complexity of dealing with the government programs. Medicare comes in four parts: A, B, C, and D. Part A covers hospital bills, at least briefly. It already has been paid from your payroll or self-employment taxes, and you should sign up for it when you reach age 65. Part B covers some doctor bills, and you should get it at the same time as Part A or when you no longer are covered by another plan. Part B is paid by you currently or deducted from your Social Security payment. It doesn't cover everything, so you can purchase a private medigap insurance policy that comes in flavors A through J. A policies cover the least and cost the least. J policies cover the most and cost the most. All policies of the same letter offer the same features. These policies change from year to year, and which one is the best for you also changes from year to year. Part C is like an HMO and eliminates the need for Parts B and D. Part D covers prescription medicines, and it really requires a separate private insurance policy.

If you, your family members, and your clients know all there is to know about these things, you don't need the class. On the other hand, you probably do need the class. The details are attached to this issue of *The Accountant*. Hurry, because the prices go up soon.

While you're at it, sign up for the Convention which follows the class. It, too, is being held at the Marriott at the Durham Convention Center. If you want to take advantage of the low \$99 a night rate at the Marriott, you need to act promptly because our room block runs out soon.

I'm looking forward to seeing you all at the class and Convention.

Peer Review Standards Revised

The AICPA recently issued revised **AICPA Standards For Performing And Reporting On Peer Reviews**. The revised standards are effective for peer reviews commencing on or after January 1, 2009. The revisions include a more concise peer review report as well as principles-based standards.

Where's My Refund?

“Where's My Refund?” (<http://www.irs.gov/individuals/article/0,,id=96596,00.html>) is fast, easy, safe and convenient. Nearly 9.7 million taxpayers have checked the status of their 2007 federal income tax refunds online, up about 18 percent over the same time period last year.

To get to personalized refund information, taxpayers should be ready to enter their:

- Social Security Number (or Taxpayer Identification Number),
- Filing status (Single, Married Filing Joint Return, Married Filing Separate Return, Head of Household, or qualifying Widow(er)),
- Exact refund amount shown on their tax returns.

Taxpayers can check on the status of their refund seven days after e-filing a return. For a paper return, check four to six weeks after mailing the return.

Some scam artists are sending phony emails, including those relating to “Where's My Refund?”, to trick individuals into revealing personal financial information that can be used to access their financial accounts. People who want to access the genuine IRS Web site and the “Where's My Refund?” feature should go directly to the IRS Web site by typing the address, www.irs.gov, into the address line of their Internet window. The only genuine IRS Web site is IRS.gov.

IRS Issues Draft Instructions for 2008 Form 990

The IRS requests comments on the draft instructions for the 2008 Form 990, the return most tax-exempt organizations must file annually. To get the draft and find out how to send in comments, see news release [IR-2008-60](http://www.irs.gov/newsroom/article/0,,id=181460,00.html) (<http://www.irs.gov/newsroom/article/0,,id=181460,00.html>). The comment period runs until June 1, 2008.

Submit Recommendations for Guidance Priority List

The Department of Treasury and the IRS invite public comment on recommendations for items that should be included on the 2008-2009 Guidance Priority List. Deadline is May 31, 2008.

ABA Cram Course to be Offered

NSA is holding an ABA Cram Course just prior to this year's Annual Meeting in Kansas City. The two-day course will be offered August 25 & 26. The ABA test will then be given on August 27. The fee is \$345 for early bird registrants and \$445 for those registering after July 1. Affiliates members will be treated as NSA members and receive the member price.

Registrants will receive the ABA Prep Book in CD format and the ACAT Study Guide to begin studying for the examination. The registration fee also includes ABA testing fee, preview self-test, and breaks during the Cram Course. In all, registrants realize a savings of \$235 over the cost of the items individually. Special 50-Percent Depreciation Allowance

[IR-2008-58, April 11, 2008](#)

The IRS will issue guidance for businesses on how the special 50 percent depreciation allowance that was included in the Economic Stimulus Act of 2008 can be used to make capital investments this year. Until the guidance is issued, businesses may rely on the regulations previously issued regarding bonus depreciation.

The Economic Stimulus Act of 2008 provided a significant tax incentive for businesses to make capital investments by adding a special 50 percent depreciation allowance for qualifying purchases. This special "bonus depreciation" allowance is available to all businesses and applies to most types of tangible personal property and computer software acquired and placed in service in 2008. It allows taxpayers to deduct 50 percent of the cost of qualifying property in addition to the regular depreciation allowance that is normally available.

Political Campaign Activity by Charities

The prohibition against political campaign activity has been in effect for more than half a century and bars certain tax-exempt organizations from intervening on behalf of or in opposition to political candidates. However, these organizations can engage in advocating for or against issues and, to a limited extent, ballot initiatives or other legislative activities. The IRS is making extensive efforts to educate 501(c)(3) organizations, political parties and candidates. A letter was published in the Federal Election Commission's monthly newsletter (March 2008), asking candidates to ensure that their contacts with charities and churches do not inadvertently jeopardize the charity's tax-exempt status.

Retirees, Disabled Vets Still Can File for 2008 Stimulus Payments

Even though April 15 has passed, the Internal Revenue Service reminds retirees, disabled veterans and others who normally do not file a tax return that there is still time to submit a 2007 form to receive an economic stimulus payment.

People who have no tax filing requirement but have at least \$3,000 in qualifying income should file a simple [Form 1040A](#). Qualifying income includes any combination of earned income, nontaxable combat pay as well as certain payments from Social Security, Veterans Affairs and Railroad Retirement.

Those not required to file a return because their income is too low or nontaxable must file a simple Form 1040A with basic information to ensure that they receive the economic stimulus payment. The Economic Stimulus Act of 2008 provides a minimum payment of \$300 (\$600 for married couples) plus the \$300 payment per eligible child, if the person (or married couple) has at least \$3,000 in qualifying income.

The types of Social Security benefits that are considered qualifying income include retirement, disability and survivor payments. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is not qualifying income. The types of Veterans Affairs benefits that are considered qualifying income include disability compensation, disability pension and survivor payments. Qualifying Railroad Retirement payments include the social security equivalent portion of Tier 1 benefits.

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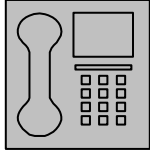
